Anglers must be younger than 16 years old and parents must accompany their children during the duration of the clinic. **Pre-registration is required and is limited to 120 participants.** Registration begins June 1 for members and June 15 for non-members. Due to limited registration, participants are strongly urged to commit to attending the clinic after having registered with the office.

## ABOUT GLA'S YOUTH FISHING CLINIC

Registered participants will learn the basic knowledge needed to begin fishing as well as the importance of clean water to good fishing. Mini lectures, demonstrations, and activities will take place in a station format to maximize learning experiences. As participants move from one 15-20 minute station to the next, local anglers will share their knowledge about topics such as:

- water safety
- fishing regulations and ethics
- fish identification
- tackle assembly and bait types
- knot tying
- casting, hooking and landing the catch.

After completing each station, participants will be given their very own fishing poles to test their newly acquired angler skills, courtesy of Walleyes for Tomorrow—Green Lake Chapter. Goodie Bags, fishing poles, and invaluable wisdom are sure to provide participants with a memorable and exciting experience!

## WHERE IS GREEN LAKE ASSOCIATION'S YOUTH FISHING CLINIC?

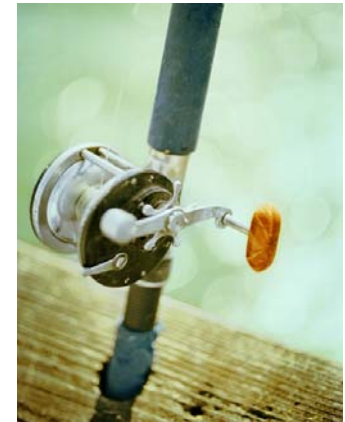
